







SAFETY SUMMARY 2019

Another year older, another year wiser so they say!

Firstly, a massive thank you for making my job as Safety Officer so much easier. Reports of incidents are coming through much more quickly than they did a year ago. Additionally, every incident reported was dealt with quickly and efficiently by the Volunteer Walk Leaders on the ground! A major pat on the back for all concerned.

As promised 12 months ago here is a summary of how safe we were in 2019. Bear in mind we now have 29 walks every week, so a significant number of people walk with us, and accident statistics reflect those numbers.

As someone who managed Health and Safety as part of their job, I must say that for an organisation as large as Step Out Sheffield, only to have 15 reportable incidents in a year is an exceptionally good performance and reflects extremely well on the Volunteer Walk Leaders and Walkers.

As I said last year (literally!) Trips and falls are almost inevitable, and there is not a lot we can do to avoid them. I am absolutely certain that leaders put a lot of thought into where they are walking especially in bad conditions.

One incident of note involved a walker who fell in woodland needing assistance from an ambulance, where the exact location of the casualty weas difficult to define. That incident prompted the issue of Safety Bulletin 9 covering the "What 3 Words" app.

Please keep advising me of any incidents, even if you think they are insignificant.
